Apply for Continuity of Practice Certificate without Delay

A. A Certificate of Practice, issued by the State Bar Council, confirms an advocate's active enrolment and good standing with the council, demonstrating they haven't faced any complaints. This certificate is essential for advocates to continue practicing law.

B. What it is:

- 1. A Certificate of Practice (also known as a Continuity Certificate) is a document issued by the State Bar Council, confirming that an advocate is currently enrolled and authorized to practice law.
- 2. It signifies that the advocate has not been suspended or disbarred and is in good standing with the Bar Council.
